



STS, REGINA CHAPTER HISTORY BY DECADE

THE 1980s

The first residents of the *George Taylor Housing Coop* (now called *Oxford Manor*) moved in. In 1984, *Stewart Court* was built next door, and later another housing coop was built on *Rochdale Boulevard*.

Nick Froh, Regina Chapter member, was elected Provincial president in 1982-83.

A Provincial recreation committee was set up. Regina Chapter donated a trophy for the golf tournament.

The Saskatchewan Teachers Federation granted full voting rights to four STS councillors, which gave superannuated teachers a voice at the Provincial teachers' organization, on behalf of their members.

Participants from almost every province and territory met and recognized a need for a National Association of Retired Teachers.

During 1988-89, superannuates pension cheques were deposited directly into their bank accounts. That same year, *McGregor Hone* of Regina Chapter was elected Provincial president.
